

Greetings,

It hasn't been a month since the last update, but our last 2 weeks has had a lot going on. We left Tulsa almost 2 weeks ago and went to Cincinnati Ohio for the Missionary convention. It was the best one ever. We didn't have a spare minute. I usually get all my Christmas cards addressed during the conventions but I had no time this year. We spent a lot of time net working with others from Africa and organizations that would be of help to us in South Africa. We got a load of good information. I found a man who has an organization that deals with AIDS. He has a lot of training information and a book. I've got the book and they send out e-mails with new updates on new information that is discovered on a constant basis. We are hoping to be able to get into one of their training classes before we leave the country. But if not, we still have his e-mail address and can ask questions when we run into something we need information on. We got about 7 more people who signed up for our e-mail updates. We met more people who we had heard about that work in Africa, so now we have faces to go with names. Got handy packing tips from seasoned travelers to Africa. We spent some time with Michael Calamia who works in our area 4 months out of the year. He is going to fix our website for us. He told us about all kinds of websites to sign up with, for fund raising. I'll mention those later in the letter. He told us about a website that non-profit organizations can sign up with, and we can buy computer software for pennies on the dollar. We can get Microsoft office for about \$16. We have signed up and sent proof of our non-profit status and are waiting for the approval to come in. What a blessing that is. At the convention they had a resource center that sold books. They were offering missionaries a coupon for \$25 worth of books, as long as the coupons lasted. I waited until almost the last day to buy books, then figured if there was a coupon left, I would use it. They still had some left, so we saved a lot of money on the books we got.

We also recently learned that the apartment the church we will be attending in South Africa owns, is now vacant and they are going to save it for us. So we know where we will be living now. We haven't seen it yet, but it is close to where the children live, so we will save a lot of time and gas, being that close to town.

Great news, we received word that our 3rd and final box of books has arrived in South Africa. That was a great relief, that it turned up.

While we were gone, Paul's truck sold, and we have a final offer on our house. We have to sign a contract and then wait to see what the inspector's find. But it sure looks like the house is gone also.

Closing is supposed to be about the 20th of December. After that date, we can receive mail at the following address until we leave for South Africa:

Of course our home phone will no longer work. Paul's cell phone is 918-520-3382, please use that number from now on, to contact us. We will have that number up until we leave the country on 27 Feb 2008.

We will not have an address in South Africa until after we get there. Mail is delivered to a postal box,

and we will get that as soon as we can, and will immediately send it out in an e-mail. In the between time, you can always send mail to our forwarding agent, and it will get to us eventually.

I'm not sure who I have given or sent a prayer card to, but if you would like one of our pictures to hang on your refrigerator, please send me an e-mail and I will send it to you.

We have received approval from our church, for the next 3 Sundays, we can sell our neck coolers in the lobby of the church. We're billing them as "stocking stuffers", since it's not exactly neck cooler weather.

More good news, our church and another individual have provided us with the \$3,000 that we need in January for our missionary training, so we don't need to pull that money from the account that is accumulating for the purchase of the truck we will need when we get to South Africa.

For those that can make it, just a reminder that Paul's ordination ceremony is on 9 December 2007 at 3pm at Cedar Ridge Christian Church 4010 West New Orleans (101st street), Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. There will be a reception afterwards at the church.

One of the fund raising websites we signed up with is a "mall", where you can buy items on-line through a bunch of major retail stores, and we get a small percentage of what you spend. You can access our mall at this address and get more information there:
