Where has the time gone? It seems like we just wrote a newsletter, and now Christmas is not too far around the corner. Brittney, our volunteer teacher, has continued to be a blessing for us. She's been working hard with the children on their school work and also has our house moms hard at work making beaded bracelets, which allows them to supplement their income and bring additional funds to The Fold. Brittney has advertised the bracelets on facebook and her family and friends have been hard at work selling them. At this point she has already sold almost \$400 worth.

We've been blessed with a lot of meat donations this month from Kwalata Game Lodge. They are friends of the Fold and this month donated a wart hog and over 80 kilos of sable that had been turned into mince (hamburger). This helps us to have a varied menu in the homes. We have never had mince donated before. We usually just make stews out of what we receive. We also had a couple from the states visit us for a few hours. They found us on the internet prior to their visit to South Africa and asked what they could bring. They brought a huge amount of school supplies, balls and vinyl mattress protectors. They're hoping their church will get involved with us as well. We even had friends from Tulsa who were passing by on their way north to do bible distributions. They stopped in for a quick look and had lunch with us. It was great to see some old friends and a few new friends.



Additional blessings this month included the donation of 15 sets of winter sheets with The Fold logo on them. This donation came from one of our board members, Ivy Mabotja, and her sister. They're really beautiful. Also, Michael Calamia from A World Aware brought two ladies, who transformed the walls of Michael house in only one day and did a fantastic job. Michael house is so much nicer with all the paintings on the walls now.



All the children are doing very well. With our second house open now, everyone has settled in to their new routines and new homes. Tumelo has adjusted very well and 15 month old Lettah has now started walking.
