This month we have had some of the schools go on small strikes, in most cases a work slow down, which meant one child didn't receive her report card and another child only got 2/3's of a report card. Hopefully these labor issues will be resolved soon.

Lucky and Teyani went to the eye doctor this month. The doctor decided Lucky didn't need glasses and hoped he'd out grow his problem. Lucky goes back in 6 months for another checkup. Unfortunately they found a lesion in the back of Teyani's eye. He goes into the hospital on 25 May for 3 days. They will do blood tests and a CT scan to find out what it is. Paul's back was out most of the month. After lots of physical therapy and medication he is finally starting to feel better. I think it's been about a year since our last chicken pox outbreak. Now that we have 9 new children, we are once again experiencing the chicken pox. So far two have it.



And now we are 16. We only had room for one additional child and Kamogelo has come to join us this month. He will be 9 years old next month. He was abandoned with only a grandfather who couldn't take care of him. We are happy that we had the room available to give him a better life.

We are busy this month and next month getting everything looking nice. We are having our first open house at The Fold on 1 June. Some of our

directors/board members will be here 1 June to help with food and chatting with our visitors.

Our future helpers, Adam and Jennifer Hayes are planning on arriving here sometime the end of July. They have their big fundraising campaign at their home church on 5 May. We also have quite a few international visitors lined up for June and July. If you have extra time in your life, especially if you are retired, we can use a lot of skills here.

We are registered with an organization called Great Non Profits. Last year we had enough nominations to get into their "top rated awards" list. They are looking for nominations for 2013 now.
