We have spent some time with Peggy and Harry Parham who have a tower garden ministry. This is a way for us to spend more time in the township getting to know the people who are having tower gardens put in their yards. A tower garden is a tall structure that you can plant a lot of plants in a small area, and it uses a small amount of water. We are also getting to know Katrina, who lives in the township. She is being hired as the local resident in charge of the tower gardens. She has been helping us with our language as well, and we hope to use her to get to know some of the more needy people in the township. Especially those with orphans. Katrina has even raised some of her relatives children, because of deaths in the family. We just learned that one of her sisters has died, so we will see if this results in more orphans in her household.

It's the time of year that we have a lot of visitors from the states. The next few months will be a busy time for all here. Next week, we will be tied up in a seminar. Stu will be giving his seminar to a large group of the local young men from the township, and we are also going to take it, to see how it goes, with the possibility of giving this seminar in the future.
