Last month was pretty uneventful, but this month was nuts. The majority of the province was flooded. Some of the areas have been declared disaster areas. At this point, I think there are still people in this area who are unable to get off their farms. Multiple dirt roads have been completely washed out, and quite a few paved roads are washed out. Over a two and a half week period, we received constant rain. We missed about 5 days of school. If the town wasn't under water, it was our driveway that turned into a mud bog that kept us on the farm. We ended up having to tow vehicles out of our driveway on four occasions. We were pretty lucky in regards to the effects of the floods on us. We didn't incur any financial damages to our vehicles or property.

Paul and Micky finally got their third set of 3 year visas approved. We have been here six years already and our current visas will last until August 2016.

We've had some great visitors this month. The Botzum's who arrived last month, departed this month. We had some great times together, the children were blessed with a lot of activities with the Botzums, including a VBS that got the children planting seeds in a clear plastic glove. When the seeds sprouted, the children all went to the garden and planted their beans. They will watch them grow, and eventually eat what they personally grew. The Botzum's have decided they think this area is where God wants them to be. So the process starts of raising funds and monthly support before they can move back here. Their gifts and talents will be hugely appreciated by all of us. Another group of friends from Texas came and spent 4 days. They had really creative and fun activities for the children. Everyone had a great time.
