Just in the few weeks they have been with us, their little personalities are really starting to shine.



The first day of school was January 12 and it was both Kgaogelo and Tebogo's first year to attend. Kgaogelo is in kindergarten and Tebogo is in the first grade. They were both very excited to be going to school.

We have had quite a bit of rain this month. This has slowed down progress on going forward with the fenced in garden area. It's been too wet to plow. Our friend Martin from England who is sponsoring this project is currently in the area. The design has been worked out, and the parts ordered for the tunnel that will help protect the vegetables from the animals and too much sun. We hope to start erecting the tunnel in about two weeks. But in the meantime, Harry has assembled a worm farm, which will supply him with fishing worms and help with the compost for the garden. It didn't take long for the monkeys to discover this project, and they have been chowing down regularly on all the table scraps and rotten vegetables we throw in there.

We received quite a few bikes this month from a bike shop in the city. Thato was over the moon with a bike that was just his size. We also have a volunteer who will stay with us a few days a week. Tracey is helping with the children, and also, helping them to learn to ride the bikes. Natan our resident painter we told you about last month, has moved on. He has left a really great legacy with the beautiful paintings he left behind.
