Now the children can relax and not be worried anymore; we are very happy.

The vegetable garden is coming along. We're getting lots of spinach every week. Good nutrition for the children. Some of the tomatoes are also ripe enough for harvesting.

The children were on school break at the beginning of the month. The few children that stayed with us during the break were spoiled rotten with lots of trips.
