After being stuck in Johannesburg for 4 days, I took the bus home only to realize there were immediate problems that needed to be checked. We took it to our local mechanic who found all kinds of problems with it. Because of the holidays it took awhile to get the needed parts. The bus was basically in the shop for the entire 2 ½ week school break. Not only did we not get to have any outings with the children, we had to use the car and the truck to get us all to church for Easter. But we received the bus back just in time for school to start. Thankfully Adam had all the computers up and running and the children had computer time almost every day, plus we had some visitors during the break to come and play games with the children.

On the last Friday of the school break, we had a mobile clinic bus sponsored by our local electric company to come and visit. All the children received a very thorough inspection including, eyes, ears, injection updates, etc. None of the children need glasses and all of them have good hearing, so no more excuses about not hearing mama.





This month was the school's annual festival. The Fold had booth space where we passed out brochures and sold a few odds and ends. Our children had been saving pocket money for a month, so they had a good time as well.

Our local social welfare department said they would be back in touch with us about mid May in regards to our registration. They are still working on our package.

Our shipping containers have already been filled up. A company in a nearby town was closing shop. They gave us literally "everything". It will all be put to good use within the next year.

We had two 19 year old young men, George and Archie, who came to help us for five days. We gave them a very long list of various cleanup jobs they could do on the property. We were so amazed that these two young men managed to get almost the entire list done in five days and still had time to play a few games with the children.



On a sad note, the Hayes family has decided to return to the US. They will be greatly missed by us and the children. They leave behind great memories and lots of projects that were accomplished during their stay. They'll be leaving on 8 May. This will leave us very short on manpower. Please spread the word. We desperately need more missionaries to join us. We are also still looking for teachers to help us.
