This month we stayed fairly busy. The month began with our friends Brett and Evelyn from Swaziland coming to spend the weekend with us. It was great to see them again, and Brett did communication training with the house mothers and Paul and Micky. It's always interesting to learn about your communication style, and understand the styles that the people around you have.

We also have two teachers, Pamela and Carley, from Georgia who arrived to spend 5 weeks at The Fold. They have only been here two weeks, and already have been amazing. Lots of computer time for the children, lots of one on one time doing work sheets with the children who are behind in various areas of learning.



George and his friend Brooke spent 3 days working on projects around the Fold, and managed to get some playtime in with the children as well.



We still haven't gotten enough volunteers to cover the Fold for the two months of our furlough. We currently may have one individual who can come and help keep an eye on things. With his help, we can each take a few weeks separately with the comfort of knowing the other has some backup.

Our birthdays this month were Lettah (4), Gadibo (12) and Jessica (10).



Our meeting for the 10th of June was rescheduled to 23 June. Four of our directors were able to get away from their busy schedules and attend the meeting. The meeting lasted two hours and a lot was accomplished and discussed. The social workers panel is going to forward our package to the individual who has final approval, with the recommendation that The Fold be approved as a private hostel. This will be good news, as we will be able to start accepting more children into our program. We were told it could take about two months before we know anything.

School break started on 26 June and school will resume on 20 July. Thankfully Pam and Carley are here to help us keep them busy. Some of the children have home visits scheduled.

Additional missionaries to meet current needs at The Fold, especially teachers. Protection and stability for The Fold children. Volunteer relief so we can go on furlough later this year.
