They've now purchased their plane tickets and will be arriving in South Africa on 26 July. Now that we have a confirmation on their arrival, we've also purchased our tickets. We'll be arriving in Tulsa on 18 October and leaving Tulsa on 3 January. We're already filling up our schedule.
