For those of you who met 15-year-old Abram or heard us talk about him during our furlough, we wanted to let you know he died on 18 March. He left here just before Christmas and said he didn't want to come back. He actually had a history of doing that everywhere he went. He was a very sick child, and it was only a matter of time. Since the social worker could find no one else to take him, he stayed at the clinic where he was being helped. They were having staff rotate and spend the night with him at the clinic. It was actually better for Abram that way, since we weren't trained to handle his medical needs. During his time at the clinic, he not only had the benefit of trained care givers, but the doctor

brought him to Christ before he died. Abram's in a better place now and will be greatly missed by all who came in contact with him.
