The first week of October was a school term break. Usually most of the children stay with us since it is a short break, but this year only five stayed. So of course we needed to spoil those five. First, we needed more space in the freezer, so they had the terrible job of finishing all the ice cream. Then, Paul and Micky had the mom's and children come to their house for dinner and a movie, and finally we took the group out to our local version of the zoo (Evanteria). There, they saw all the animals, had a picnic lunch, and spent the rest of the day at the pool.



We were visited one Saturday by a group from the local Living waters church who came to spend the day with the children. They played lots of games, provided lunch, and also brought clothing they had collected.



As year-end approaches, please keep us in mind for any additional tax deductions you're needing. We have several projects requiring special funding at this time. The bathroom in our very first home, built 6 years ago, is in need of refurbishing; and our school requires additional security measures so we can move the computers into the building so the children can have more computer time. This work will include security doors, burglar bars and building a wall between two of the classrooms. In addition to these smaller donations, we are in urgent need of two small apartments to house future

volunteers. Donations sent to the address at the bottom of the page are tax deductible and will allow us to complete these projects.

We need volunteers in December. The children will all be going to stay with relatives during the long school break, so this is the perfect time to get a lot of jobs done, and gives us plenty of empty beds for volunteers. We would love to have any amount of time



you can give us, from a few hours, up to the entire month. We need electrical work, plumbing, carpentry, welding, tiles laid, cleaning, bush clearing, etc.

We're on our second batch of baby chicks. This time we're raising 300. They'll be ready the end of November and we already have buyers for them. They'll be sold live, which will cut down on our costs. Our freezer is full of chickens from the first batch, and

our laying hens are almost keeping up with the needs of the houses. One of our layers hatched 13 eggs, so some of those will become additional layers when they grow up.

Micky is still waiting for her visa to be approved. It's been caught up in the system for three months now. Please pray she gets hers soon.
