This month was one of those that was beyond busy. But also amazing and awesome. We had received enough donations to afford a tractor. After months of searching we found the perfect one. The men are very happy with the tractor. We also received soccer goals from Shanahan Engineering. The children worked very hard to clear the ground between the goals, so they could start playing soccer. A group of companies that support the Medupi mine brought thousands of Rand worth of food, bedding and gardening supplies. They were very impressed with what was happening here. We have also started getting dough offcuts from Debonairs pizza. They cook it into flatbreads and bag it up for us. The children love it, and it saves us money on food. We had some visitors and we put them to work harvesting the sweet pea crop; the children helped pick as well. The kids love the peas; they eat them like candy. A nearby game farm donated 3 female impalas and plans to bring us a ram later this year. We were down to only one female impala due to poaching.



Paul got his visa renewed in only two weeks. Micky's is still caught up in the system almost a month later. Please pray she gets hers soon.

The full grown layers and 200 baby chicks will arrive later this week, and we'll be in full production.

Mom showed the house moms how to make southern fried chicken and we all had chicken dinner on Sunday. They are both spending time with the children when they're not in school, making curtains and a lot of other various manual labors.
